Permit Procedures for Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Permit

In accordance with Act 451, P.A. 1994, the following items are requirements for an earth change permit:

- A. An application for permit shall be submitted to the Calhoun County Enforcing Agency (CEA) by the landowner or Designated Agent (submittal of designed agent letter required). Application for a permit shall be made prior to the start of any earth change requiring a permit and work shall not be initiated until a permit has been issued. Any unauthorized work shall be considered a violation of these procedures and can include a monetary penalty and a cease and desist order. Soil borings, vegetative cutting for land surveys, percolation tests, cutting of trees without removal of stumps, and normal maintenance shall not be considered a “start of work” under these regulations.
- B. The application shall be accompanied by a soil erosion and sedimentation control plan with the following requirements:
1. Scaled drawing of the worksite, not more than 200 feet to the inch or otherwise determined by CEA
 2. Legal description
 3. Site location sketch
 4. Proximity to lakes and streams
 5. Predominant land features (including wetlands)
 6. Slope descriptions or contour intervals
 7. A soil survey map or written description of the soils to a depth of three feet for the area contemplated for the earth change.
 8. Physical limits of each proposed earth change
 9. A description and the location of all existing and proposed drainage and/or dewatering features
 10. The timing sequence of each proposed earth change, such as starting and completion dates of the development sequence and time of exposure of each area prior to the completion of the effective soil erosion and sedimentation control measures.
 11. The location and description for installing and removing all proposed temporary soil erosion and sediment control measures.
 12. A description and the location of all proposed permanent soil erosion and sedimentation control measures.
 13. A program proposal for the continued maintenance of all permanent soil erosion and sediment control measures that remain after project completion, including the designation of the person responsible for the maintenance.
- C. At the time of application, payment of the total costs will be required before the actual plan review will commence. Should the project be canceled within 30 days of application submittal and no permit has been issued, the fee will be refunded upon written request to the Soil Erosion and Sedimentation control Agency, and if a site inspection as not been completed. Fees will be set forth on Exhibit A to this Ordinance and may be changed by the Calhoun County Board of Commissioners.
